Writers shine at **Portrush Showcase**

PORTRUSH Town Hall provided the setting on Saturday night (11 October) for the Third Annual Showcase segment of the Soundwaves Writing Competition run by the Impspired Publishing Company based in Lincoln, and facilitated by Portstewart author Mary

This competition, which invited entries earlier this year from May to August, is solely for writers in the North of Ireland.

Of the many excellent submissions received, 14 winners were picked by an International Panel of Judges, all Impspired Authors based outside Ireland, from the UK, United States and South Pacific regions.

These judges declared how extremely impressed they were with the very high standard of the entries.

The work of the 14 selected winners will appear in the November 1 edition of Impspired Online Magazine, and will also be included in an

upcoming print issue.

At the Showcase section of the competition, held as part of the Swell Festival, the performance of 11 of these 14 were judged by a ocal panel of five judges - Sue Divin, the Derry/Londonderry-based author of the award-winning books 'Guard Your Heart' (2021) and 'Truth be Told' (2022), Paul Doran, a journalist for 27 years with the BBC and Co-Founder of Tenx9, the popular Storytelling Event, begun and based in Belfast and now worldwide, as well as Rosaline Callaghan, Michaela McDaid and Sarah McCaughan, the Winners from last year's three Trophy Competition.

Of the 2025 trophies presented on the night, two of them had been already chosen International Panel: one for The Best Written Poem, went to Colin Dardis for 'I have looked for Inspiration,' and another for the Best Written Prose Piece went to Catherine Kay for her entry 'Missing

Meanwhile the Prize for The Best Performance Piece, chosen by the local Panel on the night, was presented to Gary Devenney for his poem Collarbone Thoughts.
